Human Services (Associate of Applied Science)	Students learn active listening, communication and critical thinking skills needed to be successful in the helping professions. Group theories, processes and facilitation are taught. Alcohol & Drug Counseling (Certificate)	This certificate is for students who have already earned an associates degree or higher or who seek to earn their Alcohol & Drug Counseling License. Students will study the physiological, psychological, and sociological aspects of alcohol and drug use and dependence, including drug classification, the effects of drugs, and withdrawal covering signs, symptoms, and behavior patterns as well as treatment issues related to dependency. Students will also take psychology courses and learn the listening, communication, and counseling skills need to support others.	(salary listed is an average for all credentials)	Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselor	This Certificate program prepares students to take the state exam and become provisionally licensed as a Alcohol and Drug Counselor.	Students must complete a Criminal Background check, CPR certification, 2-Step Tuberculosis test, and an immunization record.
Peer Support (Certificate)	This program supports the development of relationship-building skills and recovery support that benefits anyone on their personal recovery journey from mental health and substance use disorders. It is for those with lived experience, or who have a family member with lived experience. The program teaches the 13 domains of the Peer Support level of care.	(salary listed is an average for all credentials)	Certified Peer Support Specialist working in Mental Health or Addiction Treatment Centers	This program is approved curriculum of the State of Nebraska, and prepares students to take the state exam to earn certification as a Certified Peer Support Specialist	Students must complete a Criminal Background check, CPR certification, 2-Step Tuberculosis test, and an immunization record.
