Surgical Technology	Students in the program learn how to function as an integral member of the Operating Room team. They focus on learning surgical instrumentation and procedural sequence to allow them to anticipate the needs of the surgeon. Students also master the principles of aseptic technique to create a sterile environment, allowing them to assist in safely providing their surgical patients with the least risk of contracting a surgical-site infection. Students are required to have uniforms, closed-toe shoes, two sets of scrubs, two cloth hats, and to rent an instrument tool kit from the SCC Campus Store.

The SCC Experience

- » The SCC Surgical Technology program is one of the only programs nationwide to have five full-time instructors and numerous adjuncts, allowing instructors to be present in the clinical site with our students when they are performing clinical rotations.
- » You will spend almost 600 hours in actual surgical procedures with real patients, which equates to approximately 150-200 cases performed during your clinical experience. You are required to achieve 120 cases per accreditation, but our clinical experience greatly exceeds this minimum.
- » SCC Surgical Technology program students have the ability to be hired prior to graduation and be paid during their clinical experience depending on each healthcare facility's policy.
- » SCC's Surgical Technology program is one of the only programs nationwide to be offered completely online with labs at approved locations and clinical experience completed in local hospitals, allowing communities to grow their own healthcare professionals.
- » The National Certification Exam will be administered through Applied Measurement Professionals Inc. before graduation. Upon verification of graduation by the program director, each student passing the exam will receive the official certification from the National Board of Surgical Technologists and Surgical Assistants.

Face-to-face students in Lincoln will be required to travel to Omaha for some of their clinical experience.	In general, clinical experience occurs between the hours of 6 a.m. and 3 p.m.	Students enrolled in the online/distance cohort will complete their clinical experience in hospitals/surgery centers in which affiliation agreements have been established with the SCC Surgical Technology program. The program will assist students in securing these sites, but the student may be required to drive in order to attend a site that provides a caseload variety necessary to meet accreditation caseload requirements and may need to attend multiple facilities as well.	585 hours
